Design Academy Senior Capstone — Olathe, Kansas

My senior year at Olathe East I worked on an in-depth Architectural research and design project. I spent time researching two famous modern-day architects by the name of David Childs and Peter Eisenmann in an attempt to combine their design styles into a Deconstructivist Mixed-Use Residential Skyscraper. Ex01: Abstraction of Space— *Manhattan, Kansas*

In the first project of my collegiate experience, base abstract design concepts were reapproached and I evaluated my design thinking strategies in the form of three simple spaces. The design of 3 simple spaces upon a shared landscape symbolically creates 3 major relationships between the spaces and their landscapes through their design. The First exists between all 3 spaces in that the spaces on opposite ends of the landscape transform into one another through the middle space. The Second is that each landscape mirrors the design of the space it contains. And the Third is the cohesive form all the landscapes work to create as a whole landscape for the project.

Exo3: Spatial Enclosure— *Manhattan, Kansas*

The Design constructs a complex assembly that conveys a nuanced hierarchy of space. These elements are organized along an off-center major datum and several regulating lines. The degrees of enclosure highlight the hierarchy of the space in two distinct ways. First, one space of each level of the hierarchy is entirely implied. Second the remaining spaces follow a gradient from least enclosed to most enclosed descending the hierarchy. The spatial relationships such as 'Spaces Linked by Common Space' and a 'Space Within a Space' are derived from each planar edge of the original assembly being registered in at least two of their three possible spatial influences.

Ex10: Reminiscense— *Manhattan, Kansas*

Reminiscence endeavors to call back to the history of its site through its form, its relationship to its context, and its program. This is achieved in the first metaphor of the design with the circular form of the building in the plan. This floorplan creates a cyclical circulation separated into 6 main exhibition spaces that outline the life of agricultural products. These two elements encourage the visitors to consider the cyclical nature of crop development as a process. In addition, each exhibition space tells the complete history of each process back to the Native American beginnings on the land. At the apex of the courtyard sits a symbolic Teepee that the buildings' walls bow to in the plan. The museums' relationship to the site context also accentuates the previously mentioned concepts, with gradual ADA-compliant pathways and parking options while engaging in minimal additional pathing as much respect to the terrain as possible is maintained. Finally, the project program lends itself to the respect of nature and the building taking a secondary stance on the landscape to the preference of the development its exhibitions celebrate.
